

Children's ICF/IID Single Point of Entry and Level of Care Review Cumulative and 2nd Quarterly Report FY20

Census

The Family Resource Consultant (FRC) continues to work closely with the Director of Social Work at St. Mary's and the Social Worker at Holiday House to maintain accurate information regarding the census. In the past timely communication regarding admissions presented a challenge to maintaining accurate census information, however since the implementation of Single Point of Entry, the FRC has been better able to track admissions and ask for status updates for pending applications.

As of the beginning of the second quarter for FY20 (October 1, 2019), the census at St. Mary's was **87** and there were **27** children residing at Holiday House (**114**). During the second quarter of FY20 (October 1, 2019 – December 31, 2019), there were 2 admissions and 1 discharge at Holiday House leaving the census at **28**. St. Mary's had **3** admissions and **6** discharges bringing the census to 83. There were no deaths this quarter. The total census as of December 31, 2019 was **111**.



Single Point of Entry and VIDES Summary

During the 1st quarter of FY20, the Community Transition Team (CTT) completed 20 VIDES; 8 children and 12 for adults.

Of the **20** VIDES completed:

- 20 individuals were referred to the Regional Support Team for review and recommendations for more integrated options.
- 3 children were admitted to ICF's.
- During the 2nd quarter of FY20, the Community Transition Team (CTT) completed 5 VIDES; 4 children and 1 for an adult.

Of the **5** VIDES completed:

- Five individuals were referred to the Regional Support Team for review and recommendations for more integrated options.
- Five children were admitted to ICF's (1 from a previous quarter).
- One adult is currently pending admission (currently in hospital).
- Three individuals received Face to Face contact to discuss more integrated options.
- One individual received phone contact to discuss options that are more integrated.
- Four individuals received the Community Transition Guide.
- Two CSB awareness letters were mailed to the CSB with the VIDES results.
- Zero Community Transition Guides were mailed to ICF residents. Six-month mailing is due by the end of January 2020.
- Eight of the SPE individuals have completed their initial LOC reviews.
- Fourteen individuals are awaiting their initial LOC reviews.
- Two children under the age of ten were discharged from St. Mary's Home.

- There have been 5 diversions since May 1, 2018:
 - Age 15- parent decided to take the individual home. Children's Hospital of King's
 Daughter assisted with securing needed equipment so that the individual could rehab
 at home
 - Age 7- parent decided to keep the individual at home. Case management services were added
 - Age 18- Individual received a CL slot in Dec 2018
 - Age 18- Placed in foster care services with Barry Robinson. Individual transitioned home with services at age 18
 - Age 14- decided to maintain CL waiver slot, exploring sponsored residential services

Level of Care Reviews

During the first quarter of FY20 (July 1, 2019 – September 30, 2019), the Community Transition Team (CTT) conducted a total of **28** Level of Care (LOC) Reviews; **11** at Holiday House and **17** at St. Mary's.

During the second quarter of FY20 (October 1, 2019 – December 31, 2019), the Community Transition Team (CTT) conducted a total of **23** Level of Care (LOC) Reviews; **5** at Holiday House and **18** at St. Mary's

The CTT evaluated documentation in four areas: Utilization Plan, Certification and Assessments, Plan of Care and Discharge Planning. Both facilities were found to be in compliance for Utilization Plans and Discharge Planning. Consistent issues remain in the areas of Certification and Assessments and Plan of Care. Identified issues included no psychological evaluation for the current plan year, late VIDES, late quarterly reviews, no signature on Plan of Care by responsible party or QIDP. It should be noted that significant improvement was noted with late quarterly reports and psychological evaluations with the introduction of the 10-day grace period and review of the current year psychological. While there were still some noncompliance issues noted, it was significantly lower than previous quarters. The CTT continues to send 6-month follow-up notifications for all recommendations and noncompliance areas identified in the LOC reviews. Our first responses should be received during February 2020.

Level of Care Review Schedule

Level of Care (LOC) Reviews are completed approximately 60 days prior to the beneficiary's annual review. This allows the CTT to provide feedback regarding areas of non-compliance from the previous year so that appropriate steps can be taken to address them as the ISP is being developed for the coming plan year.

A total of **23** LOC Reviews were completed during the 2nd quarter of FY20.

Demographics

The majority of the beneficiaries residing at both St. Mary's Home for Children (46%) and Holiday House (57%) are between the ages of 11 and 17 years.

At St. Mary's Home for Children, there is a relatively even distribution of each gender; with males representing 46% of the beneficiaries and females representing 53%. Conversely, Holiday House is 25% female and 75% male.

There is a relatively even distribution of children residing at St. Mary's with a length of stay of 7 months to 5 years (40%); and more than 5 years (53%). This is also true for children residing at Holiday House; 42% have a length of stay between 7 months and 5 years and 46% have a length of stay of more than 5 years.

Definitions:

Admission- admission occurs when the requesting facility completes their screening and review process and the individual moves into the facility.

Diversion- diversion occurs when the Substitute Decision Maker (SDM) and /or Legal Guardian (LG) agrees to explore and consequently selects more integrative options in the community.

Denial- denial occurs when the requesting facility completes the screening/review process and it is determined that the facility is unable to adequately meet the individual's needs.

Pending- pending status occurs when the SDM or LG declines to explore more integrated options and the facility is completing the screening/review process.
