

Children's ICF/IID Single Point of Entry and Level of Care Review Cumulative and 3rd Quarterly Report FY21

Census

The Family Resource Consultant (FRC) continues to work closely with the Director of Social Work at St. Mary's and the Social Worker at Holiday House to maintain accurate information regarding the census. In the past timely communication regarding admissions presented a challenge to maintaining accurate census information, however since the implementation of Single Point of Entry, the FRC has been better able to track admissions and ask for status updates for pending applications.

During the third quarter of FY21 (April 1, 2021 – June 30, 2021), there were 0 admissions and 1 discharge at Holiday House leaving the census at 27. St. Mary's Home had 3 admissions and 1 discharge bringing the census to 85. The total census as of June 30, 2020 was 112.



Single Point of Entry and VIDES Summary

During the 1st quarter of FY21, **8** VIDES were completed; **3** children and **5** for adults. (The below information pertains to children unless otherwise specified)

- VIDES process: Three families received a phone contact to discuss more integrated options. The Community Transition Guide was emailed to all three families. (Indicator 7)
- Twenty Community Transition Guides were resent/emailed to the families of ICF residents during the quarter. Mass mailings are completed in January and June. (Indicator 10)
- Fifteen of the SPE individuals have completed their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- Fifteen of the SPE individuals are awaiting their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- Two children in the ten and under category were discharged this quarter. St. Mary's Home currently has one child in active discharge status. (Indicator 12)
- The families of children 10 and under were contacted this quarter. Seven calls were completed and fifteen messages were left. (Indicator 12)
- Fourteen annual contacts were completed with families to develop a family outreach plan. (Indicator 13)
- Three Admission Awareness Letter and five Active Discharge Letters were provided to Community Services Boards. (Indicator 15)
- Eight families were linked to the VCU Family to Family Network of Virginia this quarter. Two families have been linked to a family navigator. (Indicator 13)
- Two adults were referred to RST to review for more integrated options.
- Three adults are pending an RST referral (waiting for the ICF to be licensed).

During the 2nd quarter of FY21, **7** VIDES were completed; **3** adults and **4** children. (The below information pertains to children unless otherwise specified)

- VIDES process: Four families received a phone contact to discuss more integrated options. The Community Transition Guide was emailed to all four families. (Indicator 7)
- Ten Community Transition Guides were resent/emailed to the families of ICF residents during the quarter. Mass mailings are completed in January and June. (Indicator 10)
- Twenty-three of the SPE individuals have completed their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- Thirteen of the SPE individuals are awaiting their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- One child in the ten and under category was discharged this quarter. (Indicator 12)
- The families of children 10 and under will be contacted in Jan 2021 for the quarterly calls. (Indicator 12)
- Seven annual contacts were completed with families to develop a family outreach plan. (Indicator 13)
- Three Admission Awareness Letter and five Active Discharge Letters were provided to Community Services Boards. (Indicator 15)
- Eight families were linked to the VCU Family to Family Network of Virginia this quarter. (Indicator 13)

During the 3rd quarter of FY21, **8** VIDES were completed; **7** children and **1** adult. (The below information pertains to children unless otherwise specified)

- VIDES process: Seven families/legal guardians received a phone contact to discuss more integrated options. The Community Transition Guide was emailed to all seven families/legal guardians. (Indicator 7)
- FRC emailed/mailed 108 Community Transition Guides to the families/legal guardians of ICF residents during the quarter. Mass mailings are completed in January and June. (Indicator 10)
- Twenty of the SPE individuals have completed their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- Sixteen of the SPE individuals are awaiting their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- One child in the ten and under category was discharged this quarter. (Indicator 12)
- The families of children 10 and under will be contacted in April 2021 for the quarterly calls. (Indicator 12)
- Two annual contact were completed with families to develop a family outreach plan. (Indicator 13)
- Seven Admission Awareness Letter and two Active Discharge Letters were provided to Community Services Boards. (Indicator 15)
- One family was linked to the VCU Family to Family Network of Virginia this quarter. It was a previous referral that was not forwarded. According to VCU, the referral was closed after receiving no response from the parent. (Indicator 13)
- A total of 3 adult VIDES Requests were received this quarter. FRC only processed 1 request because the other 2 families did not receive informed consent and decided to look for more integrated options in the community.

During the 4th quarter of FY21, **6** VIDES were completed; **3** children and **3** adults. (The below information pertains to children unless otherwise specified)

- VIDES process: Three families/legal guardians received a phone contact to discuss more integrated options. The Community Transition Guide was emailed to all three families/legal guardians. (Indicator 7)
- FRC emailed/mailed 111 Community Transition Guides to the families/legal guardians of ICF residents during the quarter. Mass mailings are completed in January and June. (Indicator 10)
- Twenty six of the SPE individuals have completed their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)
- Thirteen of the SPE individuals are awaiting their initial LOC reviews. (Indicator 9)

- There were no children in the ten and under category discharged this quarter. (Indicator 12)
- Nine families of children 10 and under were contacted in April 2021 for the quarterly calls. Nine messages were left with families and six calls were attempted. (Indicator 12)
- 20 annual contact were completed with families to develop/update the family outreach plan. (Indicator 13)
- Three Admission Awareness Letter and four Active Discharge Letters were provided to Community Services Boards. (Indicator 15)
- Five families were linked to the VCU Family to Family Network of Virginia this quarter. None of the families responded to numerous voice messages left by staff. Consequently, all five cases were closed. (Indicator 13)

There have been 6 diversions since May 1, 2018:

- Age 15- parent decided to take the individual home. Children's Hospital of King's Daughter assisted with securing needed equipment so that the individual could rehab at home
- Age 7- parent decided to keep the individual at home. Case management services were added
- Age 18- Individual received a CL slot in Dec 2018
- Age 18- Placed in foster care services with Barry Robinson. Individual transitioned home with services at age 18
- Age 14- decided to maintain CL waiver slot, exploring sponsored residential services
- Age 17- DBHDS provided a CL slot, exploring sponsor residential services. (2nd Quarter FY21)

Level of Care Reviews

During the third quarter of FY21 (April 1, 2021 – June 30, 2021), **47** Level of Care Reviews were completed for St. Mary's Home and **7** Modified Level of Care Reviews were completed by Holiday House. Due to ongoing covid-19 restrictions, Holiday House has not resumed site visits. All modified reviews were completed by Holiday House staff. Ongoing issues noted during the 4th quarter reviews included no signature for responsible party, beneficiary, or treatment team, no annual psychological, and no admission paperwork (for a second admission). FRC consistently recommends quarterly contacts by the social worker with the legal guardians to discuss available options in the community. The facilities are provided 6 months to respond to areas of non-compliance and recommendations.

Level of Care Review Schedule

Level of Care (LOC) Reviews are completed approximately 60 days prior to the beneficiary's annual review. This allows FRC to provide feedback regarding areas of non-compliance from the previous year so that appropriate steps can be taken to address them as the ISP is being developed for the coming plan year. A total of 47 LOC Reviews and 7 Modified LOC Reviews were completed during the 4th quarter of FY21.

Demographics

The majority of the beneficiaries residing at both St. Mary's Home for Children (49%) are between the ages of 11 and 17 year. Holiday House has an equal number of children (44%) between the ages of 11 to 17 years and 18 to 20 years.

At St. Mary's Home for Children, there is a relatively even distribution of each gender; with males representing 47% of the beneficiaries and females representing 52%. Conversely, Holiday House is 25% female and 74% male.

There is a relatively even distribution of children residing at St. Mary's with a length of stay of 7 months to 5 years (42%); and more than 5 years (43%). This is also true for children residing at Holiday House; 44% have a length of stay between 7 months and 5 years and 55% have a length of stay of more than 5 years.

Definitions:

Admission- admission occurs when the requesting facility completes their screening and review process and the individual moves into the facility.

Diversion- diversion occurs when the Substitute Decision Maker (SDM) and /or Legal Guardian (LG) agrees to explore and consequently selects more integrative options in the community.

Denial- denial occurs when the requesting facility completes the screening/review process and it is determined that the facility is unable to adequately meet the individual's needs.

Pending- pending status occurs when the SDM or LG declines to explore more integrated options and the facility is completing the screening/review process.
